# Principal's Report- November 9th, 2020

- Health & Safety
- We have experienced a significant drop in absences related to illness (not COVID related) over the past few weeks
- Masking- students should have at least one extra mask in case their mask gets soiled
- Water bottles- water fountains are not in use. Water bottles are essential for students to stay hydrated during the day.
- Gym- protocols as of November 2020 have been shared with staff. It is still recommended that
  students go outside as much as possible for physical education. The gym can now be used for
  low to moderate level of activity (ie. Yoga, dance). I will work with staff to determine what
  equipment could be purchased to support learning.
- Planning is happening regarding the storage of winter gear.

  - A few adjustments have been made recently to Administrative Procedure 110 School Councils.
  - There has been an addition to the makeup of School Councils in Section 2 to include an Indigenous Family Representative position on each School Council.
    - i. An Indigenous Family Representative who is an Indigenous
      - parent/guardian/grandparent of an Indigenous student at that school.
  - Working with the community, it is important to hold some space to ensure that Indigenous families are included.
  - This position should be allowed to take shape organically. Focusing on Indigenous representation first, and then walk the path with the representative and Parent Council on defining the role of the position.
  - A discussion within School Council should occur to determine how to best share this information in our school community and provide for some mechanisms for Indigenous families to identify their interest in joining the Council in this role.
